



not been confirmed yet, but should be in the near future. Don't miss one of the largest hamfests in the Phoenix Valley. It's always a good event and one worth attending.


There are lots of Public Service events happening in the next few months. Check the calendar on page 4 and consider volunteering at one. They are fun to do and are a great way to give back to the hobby.




