



Project Ecuador

Lifeguard Training, Volunteerism & Job Creation Founders: Paul Dunning and John Pearce

Project Ecuador is an international lifesaving venture for the Long Beach Lifeguard Association. Our purpose is to train citizens in Ecuador to become lifeguards, then to help guide groups to become self sustained professional ocean lifeguard services and ultimately join the International Life Saving Federation. On the job training is conducted each year during "Carnival", the 4 day national holiday celebrating the coming of Lent. Additional support in the form of lifeguard volunteers and rescue equipment is needed to continue the ongoing success of Project Ecuador as we expand from Guayas and Santa Elena to Manabi. Ecuador asked for help and we delivered.

Key Data:

- 885 rescues with only three drowning deaths since Project Ecuador began.
- Total number of donated rescue buoys in Ecuador = 110. Two Way Radios = 50.
- USA Volunteers: 2007=3 (Playas), 2008=9 (Playas), 2009=25 (Playas 11, Santa Elena 14), 2010=21 (Manta/Crucita 11, Montanita10)
- Beaches supported:
 - o Guayas: Playas
 - o Santa Elena: Libertador-Bolivar, Marglaralto, Montanita and Olon.
 - o Manabi: Murcielago, Crucita, San Lorenzo, San Mateo and Santa Marianita.
- Total number of Ecuadorian Lifeguards trained =126

Timeline and Summary:

- August 2006: Ecuador tourism official, Sn Esperanza and citizens ask for our help.
- December 2006: John Pearce and Paul Dunning train 23 lifeguards in Playas, Ecuador.

2007

- February 2007, Carnival: On the job training in Playas. Volunteers: *John Pearce, Paul Dunning and Tony Gentile*. Brought 6 buoys, uniforms and first aid supplies.
 - Beach crowds estimated near 40,000. Several rip currents, over 20 rescues, one life or death rescue. Hundreds of prevention advisories on land and via Navy boat. Several lost children returned to parents / to Red Cross

- November 2007: Meeting with Ecuador Consulate General in Los Angeles. Lobbied for paid lifeguards. Letter drafted by Dunning/Pearce forwarded to the Governor of Guayas.
- December 2007: City of Playas hires 6 full time Ecuadorean lifeguards paying a living wage.

2008

- February 2008: Pre-Carnival. Lifeguard training of 16 Ecuador citizens by Dunning and Pearce. Brought 16 buoys, uniforms, fins and first aid supplies.
- February 2008: Carnival. Ecuador state of Guayas erects 20 new lifeguard towers and hires 10 seasonal lifeguards for the peak season.
- February 2008: Carnival. Nine American lifeguards volunteer to help: Long Beach Lifeguards Marc Morimoto, Nick Korsgaden, Paul Dunning, John Pearce, Tyler Anderson, Jared Vargas, Molica Anderson, Kelsey O'Donnell and Los Angeles County Lifeguard-Matt Shafer
 - o Beach crowds estimated near 70,000. Swell up to 6 feet. Several rip currents, over 60 rescues, 15 life or death rescues. One drowning.
- April 2008: Presentation to California Surf Lifesaving Association
- Summer 2008: Article in American Lifeguarding Magazine
- October 2008: The United States Lifesaving Association presents Project Ecuador / LBLGA with the *National Lifesaving Award*.
- 2008 Cash Donations \$5,300 plus Product Donations or discounts near \$2,000.
- December 2008: Ecuador Statistics: July December: 205 Rescues and 451 Preventions **2009**
- February 2009: Carnival. On the job Lifeguard training with 19 Ecuador lifeguards in Playas and 26 lifeguards in Santa Elena; North Zone. Spanish Training Manuals distributed. Donated 34 buoys, fins, radios, uniforms and first aid supplies.

 - o Playas beach crowds estimated near 70,000. Swell up to 8 feet. Several rip currents, over 80 rescues. One drowning.
 - Montanita beach crowds estimate near 10,000. Swell up to 12 feet. Over 213 Rescues and one drowning.
 - Olon, Libertador-Bolivar, Manglaralto beach crowds 1,000 to 5,000. Over 25 rescues.
- February 2009: Letter to Rafael Correa, President of Ecuador requesting support.
- February 2009: Project Ecuador signs letter of intent with Playas Lifeguard Association to pledge continued support.
- 2009 Cash Donations year to date: \$1,700.

2010

- February 2010: Carnival. Expansion to Manta in the Province of Manabi. Plus Santa Elena: Montanita. On the job Lifeguard training with 35 Ecuador lifeguards in Manta, Murcielago, Crucita, San Lorenzo and San Mateo plus 20 lifeguards in Montanita and Olon. Donated 44 buoys, 23 fins, radios, uniforms and first aid supplies.
- February 2010: Carnival. Twenty One American lifeguards volunteer to help: Long Beach Lifeguards—Paul Dunning, Kerry Kemp. Los Angeles City-Rodney Williamson. San Diego—Dan Calvert, Michelle Ericson, Marcos Pimental. Los Angeles County-Julia Caldas, Joel Gitelson, Jeff Martinez, Bruce Moncrief, Bridget Srondon and Bill White. - Over 250 rescues on 10 supported beaches in 2 provinces.
- CPR performed on 6 victims and all were revived.
- 25 Volunteers trained over 55 Ecuadorains
- No drownings on supported beaches.

In addition to our key initiative, key milestones were accomplished:

- Cooperative agreements signed with cities of Manta and Santa Elena
- Revitalization of the Long Beach-Manta Sister City relationship to encourage future goodwill.

Lastly, our primary goal was achieved:

• The Country of Ecuador agreed to begin the process to join the International Life Saving Federation.
