Men at Lunch - Thursday, July 14 and August 11, at noon in the Library

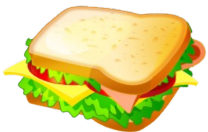

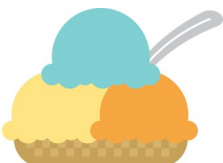


Sandwich Making in August - Tuesdays at 8 am in Williams Hall

You're Not Seeing Things in the Cemetery!

If you've walked around the cemetery, you might have seen lots of repeated family names – you're not seeing things! There is a reason: 36 family names, having 16 or more buried, constitute 32.7% of our 2,960 interments. Heading the family list with the most names are Bean (71); Beyer (58); Crawford (44); Smith (42); Trucksess (41); Custer, Highley & Hiser (38 each); Brown, Getty, & Logan (35 each); Teany (34); Miller (32); Yocum (30); Rittenhouse (29); Shearer & Hallman (28 each); Plush (25); Detweiler (24); Campbell (23); Heyser (22); and Keyser (21). Hope Prison Ministries

Hope Prison Ministries has a great need for backpacks and school supplies to be given to children whose parent(s) are currently incarcerated. Won't you and your family consider buying a new backpack and filling it with school supplies or purchasing and donating school supplies? A complete list of needed items will be on the literature table in the Atrium and will be sent by email. Barrels will be located in the Atrium to receive your donations from Sunday, July 10, through Wednesday, August 31. These items will then be distributed to students during the Labor Day weekend. Thank you for caring for these needy children.

Items requested for Kindergarten through 2nd grade: composition books, paper folders, glue sticks, scissors, colored pencils, markers, crayons, pencils, pencil sharpener, eraser, and index cards.

Items requested for 3rd through 5th grade: 3 ring binder, loose leaf paper, composition books, folders, spiral notebooks, glue sticks, scissors, colored pencils, markers, crayons, pencils, pens, eraser, index cards, and ruler.

Items requested for teenagers: 3 ring binder, spiral notebooks, composition book, folders, loose leaf paper, ruler, glue sticks, pens, pencils, highlighter, index cards, and eraser.

Norristown Hospitality Center Donations

The Hospitality Center requests supplies to help in their daily ministry. The Center offers the homeless a place to receive mail, make a phone call, get out of the weather, look for a job or an apartment and take part in a Bible study and 12-Step Programs. You can help by filling a yellow bag (available in the Atrium) with such items as: travel size toiletries, bulk coffee, sugar/sweetener packets, individual creamers, paper towels, toilet paper, socks, and underwear (list attached to bag). *Return the filled bag to the table in the Atrium.* Thank you for participating in this vital mission!

Current needs are: healthy breakfast and lunch items (especially for children), any canned meat, cereal, tomato products, spaghetti sauce, juice, jelly, and canned pastas. They also need personal care items, such as baby wipes, bars of soap, laundry/dish soap, tissues, and any cleaning products.

Days For Girls

Happy Summer! June began with our chapter joining the Wayne chapter to host the DfG East Conference at Eastern University in St. David's. It was open to any Chapter or Team to attend; a leader of a team from Wales came to the US just to attend the conference! And we were fortunate to have the Rwanda, Rwamagana Enterprise leader, Ketsia Kabanyana join us in person as well. Students from a Florida High School, team leaders from Missouri, Michigan, and Wisconsin also attended. Connecticut, New York, West Virginia and Maryland teams were there as well. Many inspiring stories, updates and lessons were shared, as well as time to work on sewing skills. Bobbie spoke about Period Poverty in the US, as well as leading the sewing clinic for Liner components. Alison led the Gold Standard tools and checklist clinic. Eva, Marjorie and Sandy jumped in with rides, set-up, cleanup and general support.

In the 2 ½ + years since the last conference much has changed in DfGI personnel, logistics, kit distribution and our impact. In October of 2018, ten years since Celeste Mergens began sending menstrual supplies to Kenya, DfGI was getting ready to announce that 1 million women and girls had been reached with kits and women's health education; today, less than three years later, that number is just shy of 2.6 million! With that growth, came the need to hire more staff. In 2018, there were just eleven staff members: today, there's a staff of 55 full and part time employees and over 70,000 volunteers worldwide. New teams are formed every month. Tiffany Larson has been named CEO, with Celeste Mergens moving to the role of Founder. The DfGI social entrepreneur program (locally owned and led Menstrual Health Enterprises) has grown to achieve sixteen countries with successful DfGI businesses. These countries no longer need to rely on donated kits. In addition, partnerships have been obtained that provide pathways to serve refugees and IDP's wherever the need is greatest. Through all the changes, the mission of DfGI has remained the same; eliminate the stigma and barriers to success that are associated with menstruation, everywhere, every person, period.



At the end of May, our Eagleville Chapter packed components for 100 kits. These were given to the Pittsburgh collection point at the conference and will be used for future refugee/IDP projects. The next project we are working on will be for a distribution in Cuba. Details still need to be worked out, but we are hoping to make this distribution this fall!

2022 Minnich Scholarship Awarded on Sunday, May 22, 2022

The 46th annual LCDR Richard W. Minnich Jr. Scholarship Award was presented on Sunday, May 22, 2022. This award honors and memorializes Rich Minnich, a naval pilot in Vietnam, who was killed in action in 1968. The award is based on the firm foundations that Rich exemplified including: significant character growth, self reliance, an awareness of the needs of others and responsiveness to them, and belief and love for God, family, and country. This year’s recipient was Emma Smull. She will be attending High Point University majoring in Accounting with a minor in Forensic Studies.

Emma is an active volunteer in her local and church community. Among numerous other activities, she has lent a helping hand during the King of Prussia Volunteer Fire Company’s 5K, Upper Merion Police Association’s Bag Bingo, and LPPC’s Days for Girls. She was an active member of her school’s crew team and is very talented when it comes to Irish dance! Emma has also been an active member of our Senior High Youth Group.

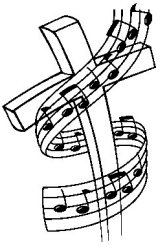

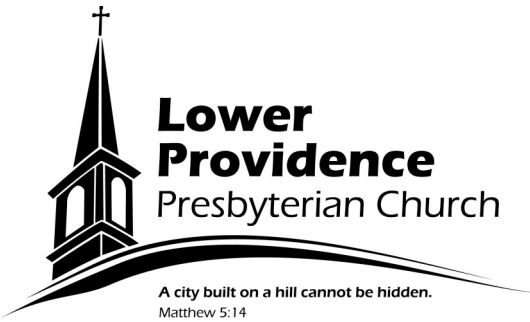
