Growing Your Garden and a Fairer Food System: 3-Week Series at Mystic & Noank Library

Hunger is on the rise. In August of 2022, 17% of adults in Connecticut surveyed did not have enough money to buy food, nearly double the amount from the year prior. And in the most recent state report on food insecurity in Connecticut, New London County saw the greatest rate of increase in food insecurity among families and children.
