#### Notes:

- (1) Automatic Rifles: These are actually Light Machine Guns (LMGs).
- (2) Bomb Guns: These are Lebel VB Grenade Launchers (i.e. Light Mortars).
- \* This will be a mix of Horse's (for the highest ranking Officers), Mules, and a few draft animals for wagons/carts (either draft horses or oxen). Note there is no motor transport at all in the Infantry Regiment, and only Company Commanders & Higher get horses to ride.
- \*\* This is presumably a Horse for the Company Commander to ride on the march, but presumably not for riding into battle!
- \*\*\* This will be entirely pack animals (mules) for carrying rations, ammo, and possibly when on the march heavy weapons like LMGs and Grenade Launchers. It is described as Battle Transport because it is present in the frontline where the fighting occurs.
- \*\*\*\* These will be pack animals to carry the four MGs (2 per MG). Presumably one carries tripod & MG while the other carries ammo boxes and water canisters (if required).

Regimental Transport: This is the rear-area transport that carries reserve ammunition, rations, and other supplies. It also includes the Quartermaster transport that will tow the mobile kitchens, laundries, and other equipment used to supply 3212 men and 777 animals in the field.

## Some final comments:

We don't have the exact breakdown for Infantry Sections in a platoon yet, however the Greek Army mainly followed French Doctrine for their Infantry Organisation (hence the 4 platoons per company), so we would speculate that a platoon would almost certainly be organised as follows:

## Platoon HQ Section:

1 Officer

4 or 7 Enlisted Men

## 3 Rifle Sections, each:

10 or 11 Enlisted Men

1 Light Machine Gun

1 Lebel Grenade Launcher (Light Mortar)

An MG Platoon would be:

## MG Platoon HQ Section:

1 Officer

7 Enlisted Men

# 2 MG Sections, each:

19 Enlisted Men

2 Machine Guns

4 Animals
